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PASSED LEGISLATION



STOPS THE BANNING OF BOOKS

AB 1078

THIS BILL:

Ensures students have access to materials that accurately represent their experiences and identities.



FOSTER CARE PROTECTION

AB 426

THIS BILL:

Authorizes the California Department of Social Services to assess an immediate civil penalty in the amount of \$1,000 per day for providing unlicensed residential care to children.



LAW ENFORCEMENT & SOCIAL MEDIA

AB 994

THIS BILL:

Requires a police department or sheriff's office to remove a booking photo shared on the department's social media page within 14 days unless the subject of the image is a fugitive or an imminent threat to public safety.



PEACE OFFICER BIAS CONDUCT

AB 443

THIS BILL:

Requires the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) to establish a definition of biased conduct and to develop guidance for law enforcement agencies when screening applicant social media accounts for bias.

Re: Request to Expand Investigation into Riverside County Sheriff's Department Correctional Facilities,
Supervised by Corrections Assistant Sheriff Edward Delgado

Dear Attorney General Bonta,

I am writing to you representing the concerns and interests of our constituents to urgently request the expansion of your ongoing civil rights investigation into the Riverside County Sheriff's Department. This request comes in light of the recent reports of sex trafficking and drug trafficking within correctional facilities in Riverside County that are under the supervision of Corrections Assistant Sheriff Edward Delgado.

Deaths in county jails have reached a two-decade high last year, and allegations of excessive use of force, sex trafficking and drug trafficking have surfaced. It is imperative to expand the scope of the investigation to include the following:

1. The circumstances surrounding the recent reported incidents of sex trafficking and drug trafficking within the correctional facilities by Corrections Deputies. These allegations have raised significant concerns about the safety and integrity of the correctional system.
2. An assessment of the effectiveness of leadership, including Corrections Assistant Sheriff Edward Delgado, in preventing and addressing such incidents.
3. A determination of whether there was any knowledge or involvement by department leadership in these alleged activities.

The people of Riverside County deserve answers, and their trust in law enforcement agencies and government institutions must be upheld. It is vitally important that these incidents are investigated by the Office of the Attorney General and not by the institution where these incidents occurred.

We thank you for your dedication to serving the citizens of California and your commitment to upholding the principles of justice. We look forward to your response and your continued efforts to protect the rights and safety of our community.
