## PASSED LEGISLATION



STOPS THE BANNING OF BOOKS

## THIS BILL:

Ensures students have access to materials that accurately represent their experiences and identities.


## LAW ENFORCEMENT E SOCIAL MEDIA

## THIS BILL:

Requires a police department or sheriff's office to remove a booking photo shared on the department's social media page within 14 days unless the subject of the image is a fugitive or an imminent threat to public safety.


AB 426

## THIS BILL:

Authorizes the California Department of Social Services to assess an immediate civil penalty in the amount of $\$ 1,000$ per day for providing unlicensed residential care to children.


## THIS BILL:

Requires the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) to establish a definition of biased conduct and to develop guidance for law enforcement agencies when screening applicant social media accounts for bias.

Allows the Governor to issue waivers for research-based and culturally specific interventions.


PUBLIC AGENCY ANTIRACISM \& EQUITY AUDIT (ASSEMBLY BILL 1077)

Requires all state agencies and counties to conduct antiracism audits and rectify deficiencies.
